


Academic Rigor



Note on the Cornerstone Campaign

Since 2015, Cristo Rey St. Martin College Prep has been raising funds for its Cornerstone Campaign. The \$28,500,000 Cornerstone Campaign is designed to finance the acquisition and construction of a new campus in Waukegan, Illinois, along with funding operational needs through 2019–2020. The School estimates that the purchase and renovation of the new campus will cost approximately \$22,000,000 with an additional \$6,500,000 being raised for operational requirements.

As a portion of the Cornerstone Campaign is designed to fund operation needs, the School has determined that any unrestricted changes in net assets available after covering all operational expenses will, for the duration of the Campaign and excluding a working capital reserve of \$900,000, be designated toward the Campaign.
